Students who meet the university admission requirements and declare Dietetics as a major will begin in a general dietetics program. During the semester students are taking HMD 341 Principles of Food Production Management, they will need to apply to the Didactic Program in Dietetics. To be admitted, students will need to have an overall GPA of at least 2.75, with no grade less than "C" in the required science and professional courses. Students will also need to submit a portfolio documenting a minimum of 150 project hours and an application packet, which includes an application and transcript(s). Your Degree Option

This program meets the academic requirements set forth by the American Dietetic Association and qualifies the student to apply for post-baccalaureate supervised practice programs. The student must obtain supervised practice experience after graduation in order to qualify to take the national examination to become a registered dietitian. The pre-dietetics program is for students who have no desire to work as dietary managers but need to complete the general education and pre-requisite courses for the Bachelor of Science degree in Dietetics.



Your Career

Registered Dietitians (RDs) are professionals who translate the science of food and nutrition to enhance the well-being of individuals and groups. Many dietitians work in health care facilities such as hospitals and extended care facilities. Dietitians also may be found working in public health settings, such as Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) programs; food stamp programs; programs for the elderly; or non-commercial and commercial foodservice operations. The broad range of opportunities for practice within dietetics provides RDs with maximum flexibility as they move through their professional careers. With growing public interest in nutrition and wellness, the demand for dietitians continues to exceed supply. Publications from the Bureau of Labor Statistics to popular magazines, such as *Cosmopolitan*, cite dietetics as a field of opportunity in the coming decade. Dietetics offers the opportunity to combine an interest in food and nutrition with the privilege of meeting the needs of individuals or groups in wellness, illness, and all other stages of the life cycle. RDs are the only health professionals trained specifically in foods and nutrition and thus are viewed as “nutrition experts.”

Note: Kansas Board of Regents requirements have been incorporated into this degree plan, including the following rules governing bachelor's degrees:

- a. A bachelor's degree must include at least 124 credit hours;
- b. It must have at least 60 credit hours earned from an institution where the majority of degrees granted are at the bachelor's degree level or higher;
- c. It must include at least 45 credit hours at the junior level (numbered 300) or higher;
- d. It must include at least 45 credit hours of general education in defined areas.

Kansas State University can apply up to 62 credit hours from community college toward the bachelor's degree.
