This degree map is shown as an illustration and example that has been reviewed and accepted by the university and the community college. Many other combinations of courses may be possible, so students should contact a K-State or community college advisor before committing to a particular transfer program.

Note: Kansas Board of Regents requirements have been incorporated into this degree plan, including the following rules governing bachelor's degrees:

- A bachelor's degree must include at least 124 credit hours;
- It must have at least 60 credit hours earned from an institution where the majority of degrees granted are at the bachelor's degree level or higher;
- It must include at least 45 credit hours at the junior level (numbered 300) or higher;
- It must include at least 45 credit hours of general education in defined areas.

Kansas State University will accept up to one-half of the credit hours from the community college toward the bachelor's degree.

General Business Distance Education Program

Hutchinson Community College-Kansas State University 2+2 Partnership

Kansas State University and Hutchinson Community College offer a 2+2 program that allows students to earn an Associate in Arts degree in General Business at Hutchinson and to transfer the majority of those credits to K-State towards the completion of a Bachelor's of Science degree in General Business offered through distance education. This degree map is an illustration, which is subject to change.

General Business Degree Option through Distance Education

K-State offers a Bachelor's of Science degree in General Business through distance education. This degree completion program is designed primarily for students who have completed the equivalent of the first two years of the business administration pre-professions (BAPP) program outlined by the College of Business Administration. The General Business degree provides a solid understanding of the fundamental areas in business: finance, accounting, management, and marketing. The curriculum is designed to prepare the student for the diverse environment of the business world. Applications for admission to this program are accepted through the Bachelor's Degree Completion Program in the Division of Continuing Education.
