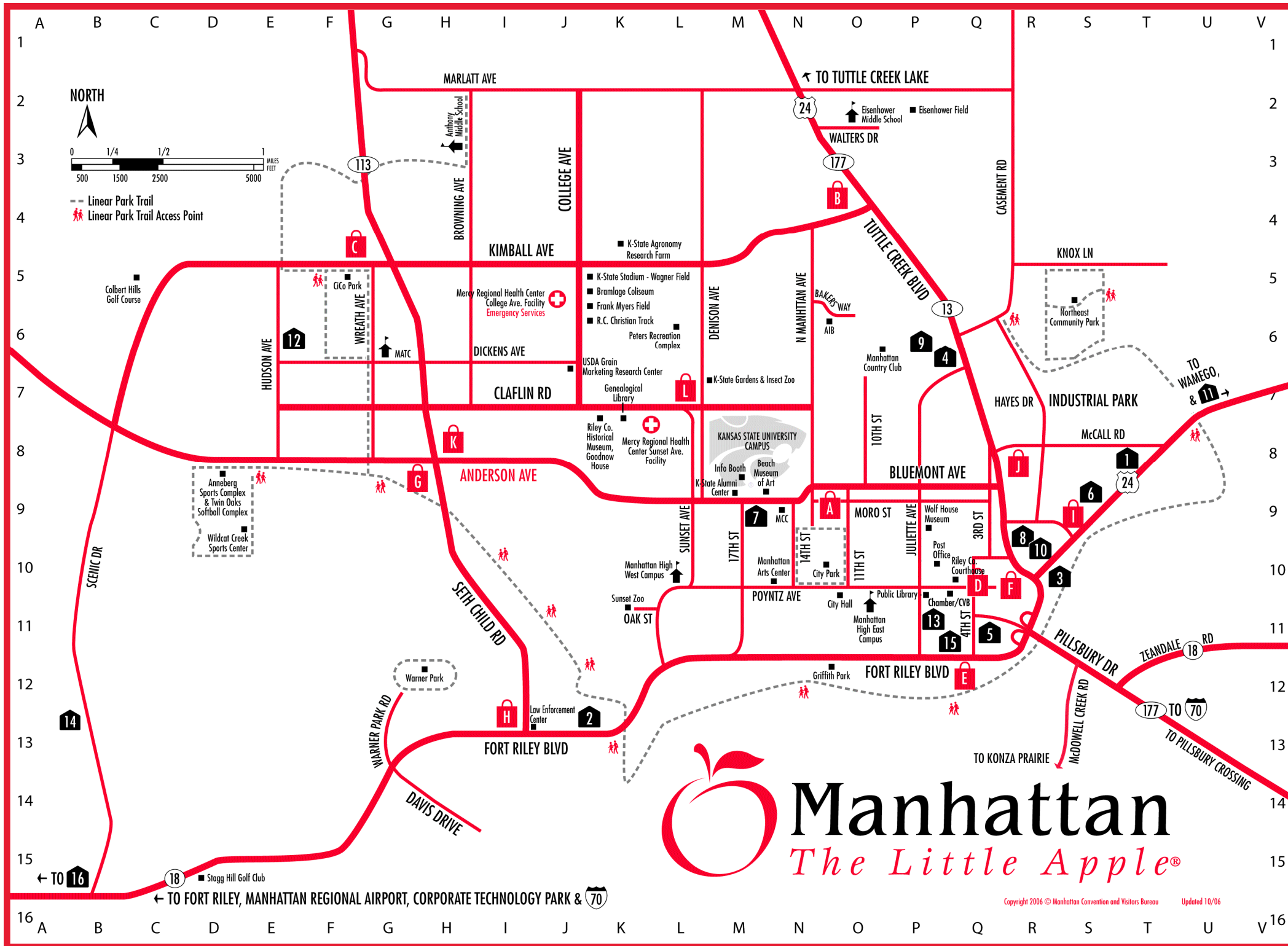

A Dozen Delightful Things to Do in The Little Apple®

Konza Prairie –

Located six miles south of Manhattan on McDowell Creek Road, the Konza contains 8,616 acres of native tallgrass prairie. A hiking trail, which begins near the entrance to the Konza, offers visitors three different hikes of 3, 5, or 6 miles in length with some of the most breathtaking scenery in Kansas. A self-guided brochure is available at the Konza Prairie entrance. The trail is open and free to the public 365 days a year from sunrise to sunset daily. Call (785) 587-0441 for more information.

Kansas State University –

Blue Mont Central College first opened its doors in 1863 to 106 students and was established as the first land-grant institution under the Morrill Act of 1862. Kansas became a state in 1861 so in a real sense, the state of Kansas and Kansas State University have grown up together. Today, K-State boasts 23,000 students who enroll in one of nine colleges: Agriculture, Architecture, Planning & Design, Arts & Sciences; Business Administration, Education; Engineering; Human Ecology; Veterinary Medicine and Technology.

The K-State campus, with its native limestone buildings, encourages visitors to take a stroll and explore its architectural beauty. Visitors can also enjoy the Beach Art Museum of Art, sample some delightful Call Hall ice cream, and cheer at Big XII sporting events. You will be proud to be a Wildcat!

Pillsbury Crossing –

Get in touch with nature at Pillsbury Crossing. Pillsbury Crossing Wildlife Area offers some of the most scenic vistas found anywhere in Kansas. Located seven miles east of K-177 near Pillsbury Crossing Lane, this 59-acre park includes a natural flat-rock crossing of Deep Creek that has served as a ford to the stream for over 150 years. Be sure to bring your camera, a picnic basket and even your canoe.

Aggieville –

Aggieville, the first shopping center established in Kansas, was named for the former K-State Aggies, today known as the K-State Wildcats. Aggieville is still a favorite gathering spot today, both for pre-game and post-game sporting events. With over 100 shops to choose from, unique dining experiences, and quaint shops visitors are sure to have a rewarding and memorable time in Aggieville.

Historic Downtown Manhattan and more –

This downtown historic shopping district provides an attractive and exciting shopping experience. With tree-lined boulevards and nostalgic light fixtures you will enjoy your time downtown. Manhattan Town Center Mall anchors the east end of Poyntz Ave. with a wide selection of shops to choose from. Manhattan offers great shopping options throughout the city, including Westloop Shopping Center, Village Plaza, Candlewood Shopping Center, Blue Hills Shopping Center and Manhattan's newest shopping area, Seth Child Commons.

Sunset Zoo –

This AZA accredited zoo is a jewel in The Little Apple®. Become immersed in the natural habitats and open space as you experience an up-close look at animals from around the world. Enjoy the chimps, tigers, pink flamingos, emus and more when you spend time at the zoo. Open 360 days a year, admission is \$4/adult and \$2/child (3-12 yrs). Goodnow House/Riley County Historical Museum –

Manhattan enjoys a rich history in the struggle for freedom before the American Civil War. Settlers, many of them abolitionists, desiring to make Kansas a free state, arrived in this region in the early 1850's. Isaac Goodnow, helped found Blue Mont College which later became Kansas State University. Learn all about this rich heritage, visit Goodnow's historic home, built in 1861. Fort Riley –

Fort Riley, "America's Warfighting Center," is known for its excellent training, abundant recreational opportunities and its rich history. The early history of Fort Riley is closely tied to the movement of people and trade along the Oregon and Santa Fe Trails.

The Custer House, U.S. Calvary Museum and Fort Riley Regimental Museum tell the history of this military post, which is currently home to the 1st Infantry Division, also known as "The Big Red One."

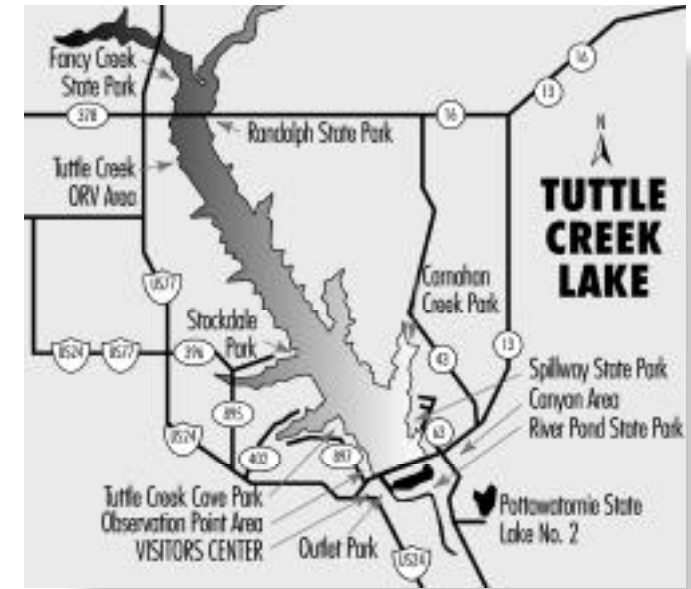
Fort Riley is open to visitors when presenting vehicle registration, proof of insurance and valid driver's license. All adult passengers must present valid photo identification.

Tuttle Creek Reservoir and State Park –

One of the region's most attractive and largest lakes, Tuttle Creek Lake is just five miles north of Manhattan. Tuttle Creek State Park includes several campsites and recreational areas around the lake. Camp out under the stars, hook up your camper to one of the full service camp sites or rent a fully-furnished cabin near the lake. Plenty of fishing spots are at the lake or at Rocky Ford, just below the dam. Thousands of acres of public hunting land surround the reservoir. One of the top-rated off-road vehicle areas in the state is located near Randolph. Permits are required and user fees charged in certain areas.

Arts Galore - Strecker-Nelson Art Gallery, Beach Museum of Art, Manhattan Arts Center

Manhattan is home to some of the top art galleries in the state of Kansas. Strecker-Nelson is a privately-owned gallery in downtown Manhattan with regular exhibits of regional artists. If you are looking to purchase original artwork or a variety of genres, Strecker-Nelson is the place to visit. The Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art, located on the K-State campus, hosts K-State's permanent art collection and offers an ever-changing menu of exhibits from its vast collection.
